• Figure out the details. In most cases, you will want to make an even exchange, so you will need to determine the dollar value of your goods or service.

Remember that, in certain situations, the law requires you to report bartering transactions on your tax return, especially if you engage in business-to-business bartering. Be sure to decide on a time frame for the exchange. And, if your exchange is worth a lot of money or is ongoing, it is best to put something in writing.

The next time you need something, consider what you have to give and see if you can arrange a trade. It's a sustainable way to meet the needs of others, and have your needs met at the same time.






- Shorter turnaround.



Kickin' Stuffed Peppers

1 (8 ounce) package Neufchatel cheese, cubed 15 fresh jalapeño peppers, halved lengthwise and seeded 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

Preheat oven to 350°F. Lightly grease a baking sheet.

Place a skillet over medium-high heat; add sausage and cook until brown; drain and return pan to heat. Stir the Neufchatel cheese into the sausage and cook until completely melted; remove from heat.

Spoon equal portions of the sausage mixture into the jalapeño halves and arrange onto the prepared baking sheet; sprinkle the Parmesan cheese over the stuffed

Bake in the preheated oven until the peppers are soft and the tops are lightly browned, about 30 minutes.
